

### Help With: 2009 MLA Works Cited Pages

Here are samples and explanations for the most common citations. For citations not on this sheet, refer to the MLA manual or a reliable website such as Purdue's: <http://owl.english.purdue.edu/owl/resource/747/01/>. To create a ½" hanging indent in *Word 2007*, select your text, right-click, then click on "Paragraph." In "Indents & Spacing," select "Hanging" in the "Special" drop-down menu, and then click on "OK."  
 Note: **The entire Works Cited page should be double-spaced.** To save paper, this handout is not double-spaced!

<u>Two or Three Authors</u> Duggan, Stephen, and Betty Drury. <i>The Rescue of Science and Learning</i> . New York: Macmillan, 1948. Print.	First Author's Last name, First name, and Second Author's First name Last name. <i>Title Italicized</i> . City Published: Publisher, year. Medium of Publication.
<u>Editor</u> Kinkead, Joyce A., and Jeannette Harris, eds. <i>Writing Centers in Context: Twelve Case Studies</i> . Urbana: NCTE, 1993. Print.	Last name, First name, ed. /eds. <i>Title Italicized</i> . City Published: Publisher, year. Medium of Publication.
<u>Work in an Anthology</u> Desai, Anita. "Scholar and Gypsy." <i>The Oxford Book of Travel Stories</i> . Ed. Patricia Craig. Oxford: Oxford UP, 1996. 251-73. Print.	Author of the Selection's Last Name, First name. "Title of Article in Quotes." <i>Title of the Anthology Italicized</i> . Ed. Author/Editor of Anthology First name Last name. City Published: Publisher, year. Page-page. Medium of Publication.
<u>Article in a Reference Book</u> Posner, Rebecca. "Romance Languages." <i>The New Encyclopedia Britannica: Macropaedia</i> . 15 <sup>th</sup> ed. 1987. Print.	Note: You do NOT need to cite the editor of a reference work. If there is an author, cite the author before the title of the article. "Article Title in Quotes." <i>Title of Reference Book Italicized</i> . Year ed. Medium of Publication.

<u>Article in a Magazine</u> Fay, J. Michael. "Land of the Surfing Hippos." <i>National Geographic</i> Aug. 2004: 100+. Print.	Note: If the article is not on consecutive pages, enter the first page number followed by a + sign. Abbreviate all months except May, June, and July. Last name, First name. "Title of Article in Quotes." <i>Journal Title Italicized</i> . Month Year: Page-Page. Medium of Publication.

<p><u>Scholarly Journal, Paginated Continuously or by Issue</u></p> <p>Wood, Michael. "Broken Dates: Fiction and the Century." <i>Kenyon Review</i> 22.3 (2000): 50-64. Print.</p>	<p>Note: When available, always give issue number.</p> <p>Last name, First name. "Title of the Article in Quotes." <i>Journal Titled Italicized</i>. Volume. Issue (Year): Page-Page. Medium of Publication.</p>
<p><u>Article in a Newspaper</u></p> <p>Strout, Richard L. "Another Bicentennial." <i>New York Times</i> 10 Nov. 1994, late ed.: A9+. Print.</p>	<p>Note: If the article has no author, begin with the title.</p> <p>Last name, First name. "Title of the Article in Quotes." <i>Newspaper Name Italicized</i> Day Month Year, edition: Page-Page. Medium of Publication.</p>

<p><u>Professional Website</u></p> <p><i>The Purdue OWL Family of Sites</i>. The Writing Lab and OWL at Purdue and Purdue U, 2008. Web. 23 April 2008.</p>	<p>Note: If applicable, insert the name of the university that created the website before the date of last update.</p> <p><i>Website Name Italicized</i>. Website Creators/Group, Date Website Last Updated. Medium of Publication. Day Month Year accessed.</p>
<p><u>Online Scholarly Journal</u></p> <p>Belau, Linda. "Trauma and the Material Signifier." <i>Postmodern Culture</i> 11.2 (2001): n. pag. Web. 30 Mar. 2007.</p>	<p>Note: Use <i>n.pag.</i> when there are no page numbers.</p> <p>Last name, First name. "Title of the Article in Quotes." <i>Journal Name Italicized</i> Volume. Edition (Year of Publication): n. pag. Web. Day Month Year accessed.</p>
<p><u>Online Magazine</u></p> <p>Engber, Daniel. "Madonna and Child, African Edition: How Do You Adopt a Child in the Developing World?" <i>Slate Magazine</i>. 11 Oct. 2006.
